Introduction Slide	 This slide should introduce the myth and give the necessary background information to understand the myth. Must contain at least one picture.
At least one slide per source (minimum three).	 These slides will each detail the argument your source makes. Is your myth true or false according to this source? Why? Each of these slides must contain at least one picture.
Your final opinion	 This slide should show your personal opinion on whether your myth is true and false, and why. Must contain at least one picture.
Citation slide	 This slide will list the citations for the websites/books that you used while conducting you research. To make the citations, go to: www.citationmachine.net Click on the MLA tab in the blue box on the left side of your screen. Click on either website, or book, depending on what your source is. Type in all the information you have recorded on your notes page. IT IS OKAY TO LEAVE SOME CATEGORIES BLANK. Only fill in as much as you can. Click "Make Citation" Copy and Paste this citation onto your citation slide. MAKE SURE CITATIONS ARE IN ALPHABETICAL ORDER
